EMPOWERED - THE CANCER ADVOCACY SOCIETY OF MALAYSIA LAUNCHES

Love Your Butt.

Petaling Jaya, Selangor (13th May, 2017) - Check Your Guts

Empowered, The Cancer Advocacy Society of

Malaysia launched its 2017 Colorectal Cancer Awareness, Screening & Treatment Project (CCASTP) at the Paradigm Mall, Petaling Jaya. Officiated by Dr. Rozlan bin Ishak, Deputy Director of the Kuala Lumpur State Health Office, the opening ceremony was immediately followed by a highly energised 2-day awareness campaign themed as "Love Your Butt, Check Your Guts". Smart collaboration between partnering Health Experts, Medical Industries and Fitness Experts pulled in the Malaysian crowds and effectively imparted vital colorectal cancer messages. Colorectal cancer is the commonest cancer in men, and second commonest cancer in women in malaysia.

This awareness campaign is part of EMPOWERED's yearly customized CCASTP, using faecal immunohistochemical test (FIT) kits in low-income communities in Malaysia. Since 2009, EMPOWERED's fervent commitment has enabled this life saving program to reach nearly 100,000 Malaysians living in under-resourced communities.

6-year findings derived from this project from 2009 to 2015 were published in the Asia Pacific Journal of Cancer Prevention, Vol 17, 2016. Based on the data collected, the level of awareness of stool examination and knowledge about colorectal cancer was poor amongst its participants. Gender, age group, ethnicity and risk factors (smoking, sedentary lifestyle and low consumption of fresh fruits) were associated with positive FIT-kit results.

President, and Founder of EMPOWERED, Consultant Medical Oncologist, Dr. Christina Ng Van Tze is an ardent advocate for colorectal cancer screening and prevention. She shares about the importance of ensuring that EMPOWERED's CCASTP beneficiaries are equipped with emotional support and an accurate road map towards obtaining optimal medical intervention. EMPOWERED's beneficiary, Mdm. Yeoh Wei Ling, was diagnosed with pre-cancerous polyps in EMPOWERED 2014 CCASTP. She shares vividly, "I was overwhelmed when I received the news that there was blood in my stool. I was afraid, and I thought I was going to die". She continues, "But thanks to EMPOWERED, their volunteers patiently sat with me through many hours of waiting in the hospital, and explained the medical jargons. They helped me to ask the guestions that I did not know how to ask. On top of everything, I did not need to pay a cent!"

PHASE 1: CCASTP 2017 COLORECTAL CANCER AWARENESS CAMPAIGN

Educational posters and props are designed and well content by the student volunteers under the supervision and guidance of EMPOWERED's, educational team and doctors.







PHASE 2: CCASTP 2017

COLORECTAL CANCER SCREENING WORKSHOP

We manage to select 16 volunteers from IMU, 8 volunteers from MSD Internship, 3 volunteers from general by recommendation to assist in the screening workshop over the month. Every volunteer are assigned to specific roles based on their voluntary and capability.







PHASE 3: CCASTP 2017

COLLECTION OF USED FIT-KITS AND ARRANGING HOSPITAL VISITS FOR RESIDENTS WITH POSITIVE RESULT (BLOOD IN THE STOOL)

FIT-Kits collection and screening are carried out simultaneously. Participants are given 2 - 3 days to collect stool samples and return the used FIT-Kit to EMPOWERED's counter at Klinik Kesihatan Jinjang on the date given.

THE LEARNING BOOTH MESSAGES OF EMPOWERED'S 2017 COLORECTAL CANCER AWARENESS CAMPAIGN



BOOTH 1: MY COLON

This booth explains the anatomy of colon, to educate the public on the function and location of colon.

BOOTH 2: WARNING SIGNS

Educating public to recognize signs and symptoms of colorectal cancer is of utmost importance – as it is the common reason people seek for medical attention.

BOOTH 3: AM I AT RISK?

Knowing one's risk on colorectal cancer could provide insight to adjust his/her lifestyle in order to prevent the disease, or to undergo suitable screening program.

BOOTH 4: UNDERSTANDING STAGES OF CANCER

Stages of cancers are not complicated. In this booth, the disease progression is thoroughly discussed.

BOOTH 5: KNOW MY FAMILY HISTORY

Knowing past history of cancer in a family is the most useful information to assess one's risk on colorectal cancer. Here, the importance of family history is discussed.

BOOTH 6: MY GENES AND CANCER

To break the taboo that genes are difficult to understand, this booth simplified the understanding towards genes and relate it to colorectal cancer.

In this station, members of the public will be empowered with the knowledge on how to prevent colorectal cancer practically - by lifestyle adjustment, or by screening, early detection, and early treatment.

BOOTH 8: COLORECTAL CANCER CAN BE CURED

In this booth, surgery for colorectal cancer is discussed - as surgery is the cure towards early stage colorectal cancer.

BOOTH 9: BREAKTHROUGH IN CANCER TREATMENT

Chemotherapy is a major part of treatment for colorectal cancer - therefore it is important to educate the public on chemotherapy as well as to abolish the fear behind chemotherapy.

BOOTH 10: SEE & TOUCH!

An exhibition of real life models of colon and sample of human colon with colorectal cancer.


COLORECTAL CANCER

WHAT IS colorectal cancer?

Colorectal cancer is cancer of the colon and rectum; the colon and rectum are parts of the large intestine that forms the digestive system and primarily helps in reabsorption of water and to discard metabolic waste. Colorectal cancer is also known as bowel cancer.

HOW/WHY DOES colorectal cancer develop?

The precise cause of colorectal cancer is yet unknown, but there are many factors that play a role over a long period of time. Hence it is possible to detect the disease early, improving the patient's outcome of a successful recovery.




RISK FACTOR OF COLORECTAL CANCER

- Age: A person's risk for colorectal cancer increases with age.
- Polyps: Polyps which are non-cancerous growths in the lining of the large intestine.
- Family history/genetics: People whose family members have colorectal cancer have a higher risk of developing the disease.
- Personal history of cancer: Women who have had cancer of the ovary, uterus or breast have a higher risk for developing colorectal cancer.
- Sedentary lifestyle: People who are overweight or obese and physically inactive are more likely to develop colorectal cancer.
- Tobacco use: Smoking increases the risk of polyp's formation.

SIGNS / SYMPTOMS OF COLORECTAL CANCER

- Changes in bowel habits: diarrhoea, constipation, changes in texture of stool (hard/soft)
- Blood in stool: Stools appear with bright or dark red blood.
- Abdominal pain: occasional unexplained bloating or fullness, tummy cramps.
- Fatigue: Feeling easily tired without obvious reason.
- Unexplained loss of appetite
- Unexplained loss of weight

STAGES OF COLORECTAL CANCER

There are **four stages** of Colorectal Cancer:

Stage I: Cancer is confined to the inner lining of the colon or rectum.

Stage II: Cancer spreads through the wall of the colon or rectum.

Stage III: Cancer spreads to the nearby lymph nodes.

Stage IV: Cancer spreads to distant parts of the body, such as the liver or lungs

CANCER THERAPIES

- Radiotherapy uses high energy X-ray to kill cancer cells. Con trary to popular belief, it does not involve electrical currents and is a painless procedure.
- **Surgery** is done to remove the tumour, together with part of the healthy intestine and nearby lymph nodes, to help ensure that all the cancerous cells are removed.
- **Colostomy** is a surgical opening in the abdomen to provide an avenue for waste to exit the body. The waste is stored in a bag that is worn by the patient and is usually a temporary solution.
- **Chemotherapy** works by stopping or slowing down the growth of cancer cells which grow and divide quickly.
